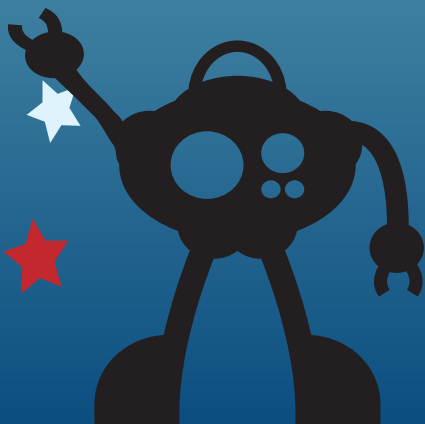

At Grace we believe that what happens at home is more important than what happens at church. Did you know that the average family spends more time together in a car in one month than they will spend attending programs in the church for entire year? It's true!

LIVE

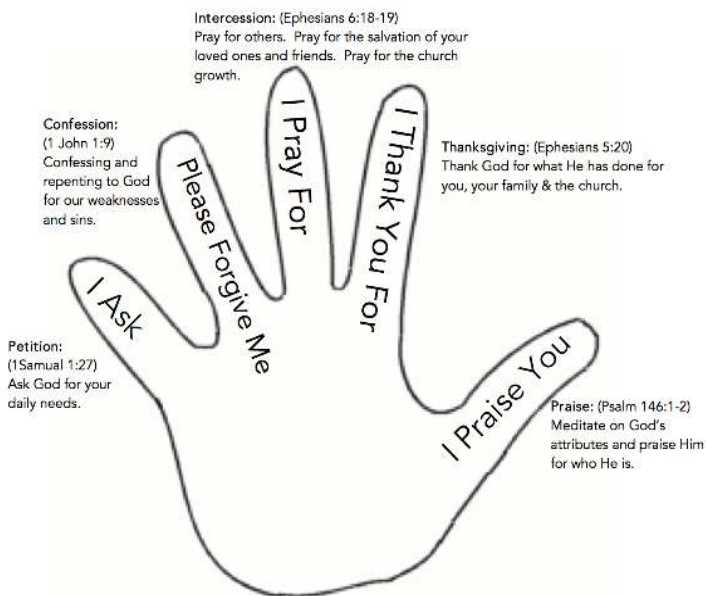
HONOR GOD WITH YOUR LIFE

WEEK 2

ZACCHAEUS

LUKE 19:1-10

BOTTOM LINE:
GOD WANTS TO CHANGE
OUR WHOLE LIFE

DAY 1

READ LUKE 19:8-10

Take a walk outside and look around at the ground, the trees, and everything that is growing. Your parents might garden or mow the lawn, but for the most part, plants and grass that grow outside can change and grow on their own. But bring a plant indoors, and suddenly that plant needs a lot of help from you. It is trapped and it's not going to be able to grow and change on its own. You have to free up the plant to grow by giving it what it needs: water and sun.

Zacchaeus was stuck and trapped by the wrong things he was doing. But when he was given what he needed—forgiveness—he was able to change. Forgiveness changed Zacchaeus' life. Instead of cheating people, he paid them back even more than he took from them. Have you ever experienced forgiveness that changed you? Before you go back inside, take some time to thank God for His gift of forgiveness.

DAY 2

FRIEND OF SINNERS

One day, Jesus visited the important city of Jericho and had a meeting.

Who with? The mayor? The bishop?

No. Jesus made a beeline straight for ... the biggest sinner he could find. (Who, by the way, was quite small and up a tree.)

It would like going to Washington D.C. and instead of having lunch with the President, finding the worst criminal and having lunch with him.

Zacchaeus was the most hated, despised man in the whole city and - of all people - he was the one Jesus chose to have lunch with. (Back then that was scandalous - it was like saying, 'Let's be friends!')

The important people sneered, 'Jesus is a friend of sinners!'

They were right, Jesus loves sinners.

And they're the whole reason he came.

'Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners.' 1 Timothy 1:15 (NLT)

DAY 3

READ EPHESIANS 1:7

Get a few sheets of blank paper—if you have colored construction paper, even better. With a parent's help, cut the paper into long strips. Use tape or glue to make a circle out of a strip (by gluing the two ends of one strip together). Stick another strip inside the circle, then glue those two ends together, and so on, until you have a long chain of paper strips. Use the final strip to bring the entire chain together into a circle.

Hang the chain somewhere to remind you how when you don't forgive, it's like being in chains. You are putting the other person in chains, but you're also keeping yourself from being free when you don't forgive. The next time someone hurts you and you choose to forgive, break the chain in half, but leave it hanging to remind you that when you forgive, you're setting yourself and the other person free!

ASK GOD TO HELP YOU SET YOURSELF AND OTHERS FREE THROUGH FORGIVENESS.

During His time on earth, Jesus gave us a short list of what to love. (Surprisingly, chicken nuggets didn't make the list.)

“Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.” This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is like it: “Love your neighbor as yourself.” All the Law and Prophets hang on these two commandments.” (Matthew 22:37-40)

First, love God.

Then, love yourself.

Finally, love everyone else as much as you love yourself.

If you do those three things, you’ve got it covered. **It’s that simple.**

Honor God with love.

If you love God, you will only worship Him. You will set aside time for Him. If you love yourself, you won’t be jealous of others. You will be content. If you love others, you won’t lie, cheat, steal or gossip. You will treat everyone with respect.
